The Heart of a Missionary, part 1

Target Passage → Jonah 1:1-16

- 1) Read the chapter and note all the different characters and objects that are faithful and respond to the Lord's command.
- 2) Why is Jonah's description of himself to the sailors ironic?
- 3) Why doesn't the Lord allow the sailors to get back to dry land?
- 4) Explain the irony of the final scene of the chapter.

Bridge Passages (for further study) → Genesis 12:1-4, Acts 2:1-21

For Me \rightarrow

- 1) What are some of the ways people hide from the presence of the Lord?
- 2) Do you think it's possible today, like Jonah, to claim to be faithful to the Lord while actively running from the Lord? What would that look like?

For the Mission →

- 1) How does Jonah serve as a cautionary tale for how we as individuals (and as a church) think about missions?
- 2) What's the diagnosis of your own heart after reading Jonah 1?

PRAYER FOCUS

Ask the Lord for a heart of faithfulness to go and do whatever he calls you to do for his mission, at whatever cost.
