Target Passage → Philippians 4:8, Proverbs 15:26-33

- 1. Consider Leviticus 22:19-22. How would this inform Paul's view of purity?
- 2. When Paul tells us to think about "whatever is pure" what is he asking us to do?
- 3. According to the Proverbs passage, what does pure thinking look like?
- 4. How can impure people ever truly think pure thoughts before the Lord? See 1 Pet.1:13-19

Bridge Passages (for further study) → Leviticus 22:19-22, 2 Corinthians 10:1-5, 1 Peter 1:13-19

For Me →

- 1. Do you scrutinize your thoughts well? How do you take them captive for Christ?
- 2. If Christ is our once-for-all pure sacrifice (and he is) why are we now called to strive for purity, not just in our actions, but right down to our thought life?
- 3. What are some ways to distinguish worldly, impure thoughts and ideas from pure thoughts that align with God's Word.
- 4. Are there areas of your thought life you have not taken captive for Christ? If you're comfortable, confess them to the group.

For the Mission → Someone says to you, "Christians act all holy. They go to church and pretend they're better than everyone. But I know plenty of Christians and they sin just like everyone else." How do you respond? Craft a biblical answer using the passages you've just studied.

Ask the Lord to give you a heart that strives for pure thoughts that are in line with the holiness of Christ. Thank him for the grace and mercy that allows you to live a life of holy and acceptable sacrifice.
