Target Passage → Colossians 3:12

- 1. What is the difference between true humility and meekness in 3:12 and the false humility (asceticism in ESV, same word as humility) described in 2:16-23?
- 2. Look at the description of the church in Laodicea in Rev.3:14-22. How did they see themselves? Why did this view of themselves need to change? How could they change it?
- 3. Why does the gospel require humility to be received at all? Does a continued walk with Christ require a lifetime of humility and meekness, or can we think and operate differently once we've trusted in Jesus? Explain.

Bridge Passages (for further study) → Col.3:5-17, Phil.2:1-11, 1 Pet.5:1-7, Rev.3:14-22

For Me → (Adjust these questions to other relationships if you are not married.)

- 1. What does it look like to wear humility and meekness in relation to your spouse? How are you personally doing with this?
- 2. How does biblical humility affect the way you see your own opinions when you disagree with your spouse?
- 3. When you've been wronged by your spouse, how does humility and meekness play a part in reconciliation?

For the Mission → Are there people in your life who may have a flawed view of the gospel because of the way you have talked about your spouse? How can you correct this?

PRAYER FOCUS

Ask the Lord to humiliate (in a good way) the prideful impulses of the people of our church, so that we would live as examples of people entirely dependent on the grace of God.
