- 2. Hannah's mouth now derides her enemies. What does she mean? Why is this an acceptable thing for a person who loves the Lord?
- 3. When God brings his judgment against his enemies, it appears it will turn the world upsidedown. In what ways? Why would God's justice do this?
- 4. Explain how the gospel is the ultimate fulfillment of vs.9-10.

- 1. How does Hannah's song encourage those who are suffering yet trusting in the Lord?
- 2. How does knowing God's sovereign reign over this world encourage you when it does seem like evil prevails, and even thrives?
